



## SCHOLARSHIP RULES FOR 2025

On behalf of the Board of Directors for the Fort Worth Association of Professional Landmen (“FWAPL”), we are excited to announce the FWAPL will offer monetary scholarships to assist qualified applicants with their tuition expenses for the 2025 fall semester. The FWAPL Scholarship Committee will accept Scholarship Applications from **June 1, 2025, through June 30, 2025. Note, Applications postmarked or timestamped June 30, 2025, will be considered timely submitted.** Thereafter, the Scholarship Committee will send an email to each applicant informing them whether or not a scholarship will be awarded to them. Each scholarship recipient will be invited to attend the FWAPL Luncheon in July, where they will be publicly recognized and presented with a check. All pertinent information regarding the eligibility requirements for all applicants, instructions for successfully completing and submitting the Scholarship Application, and important dates are discussed in detail below.

### **I. WHO MAY APPLY FOR A FWAPL SCHOLARSHIP?**

In order to be eligible to apply for a FWAPL Scholarship, an applicant must satisfy the criteria listed in Sections 1 – 4, below.

1. The applicant must be enrolled in an accredited university or junior college for the 2025 fall semester. Applicants who are undergraduate students must be registered for courses which amount to at least six (6) credit hours. Applicants who are graduate or postgraduate students must be registered for courses which amount to at least three (3) credit hours.
2. Any one of the following statements in subsections (a) – (c) of this Section 2 is true of applicant:
  - (a) The applicant is currently, and has been for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the Scholarship Application date, an Active Member (as defined in the FWAPL Bylaws) in good standing of the FWAPL;
  - (b) The applicant is an immediate family member<sup>1</sup> of an Active Member described in Section 2(a) above; or

<sup>1</sup> “Immediate family member” shall include spouses, children, step-children, step-siblings, grandchildren, step grandchildren, and siblings of Active Members of the FWAPL.

- (c) If the applicant is neither an Active Member of the FWAPL, nor an immediate family member of an Active Member, the applicant may be eligible to apply for a FWAPL Scholarship if:
- i. the applicant is a student currently pursuing a degree or certificate in Petroleum Land Management, Energy Management, Energy Commerce, or other substantially similar degree or certificate,
  - ii. and is enrolled in courses for the 2025 fall semester, the majority of which are prerequisites to earning the aforementioned degrees or certificates; and the student applicant is sponsored by a current Active Member of the FWAPL.
3. The applicant must have an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher (on a 4.0 scale), as evidenced by an official transcript(s).<sup>2</sup>
  4. The applicant must provide documentation of enrollment in an accredited university or junior college for the 2025 fall semester.

## **II. Instructions:**

Complete the FWAPL Scholarship Application form (attached) and submit (by email or physical mail to the addresses listed below) the Application, together with all attachments required therein, to the FWAPL Scholarship Committee by the June 30, 2025, deadline. Incomplete Applications will not be considered.

## **III. IMPORTANT DATES:**

- Applications must be submitted by **June 30, 2025**. Applications postmarked or timestamped on June 30, 2025, will be deemed timely submitted.
- Scholarship recipients will be presented with a check at the FWAPL Luncheon in **July 2025**. If a recipient is unable to attend the Luncheon, their check will be placed in the mail no later than three (3) business days following the Luncheon.

<sup>2</sup> An applicant's high school GPA will be taken into consideration if the applicant has not completed the first semester of their freshman year at the time the application is submitted.
